- The tour includes educational materials and conversations with activists and community organizers fighting for the right to a healthy environment.
- Ideal for schools, universities, collectives, human rights, environmental and labor organizations, faith-based groups, academics, media representatives, and anyone interested in migration, environmental issues, and labor rights along the U.S.–Mexico border.
- Group size: Minimum 10 people | Maximum 40 people
